STORY OF CARING - Together with Love by: Resident, Marie Bachman

When I was nine years old, on a very windy March night, our barn burnt to the ground. Along with the barn went the truck that carried our produce to market. All the animals – cow, steer, chickens—perished as the fire raged out of control. The tractor and other farm equipment were destroyed.

But it was in the aftermath of this family catastrophe that I saw the power of God's love expressed through the community of people who stepped forward to assist in the rebuilding process. The mountville Church of the Brethren women made food and served it to the hungry volunteer workers at a "barn raising" event, led by a mennonite contractor who donated his time to supervise a whole crew of volunteers. The image of a



whole row of men lifting rafters into place, and nailing shingles on the roof was seared into my mind. This is the power of togetherness—Family, neighbors, church friends and the community at large all coming together to share the grief and burden of loss.



Then when my elderly parents moved to Brethren Village in 1996, they joined another caring community of supportive people. They lived in a Townhouse apartment near Village Center. We celebrated their 60th wedding anniversary and gathered for a family portrait in front of the fireplace in the library here at Brethren Village.

Tragedy again struck our family on Mother's Day in 2000, when my mother had a major stroke. This time it was the Residents and Team Members of Brethren Village who supported us. Because my mother needed skilled nursing care for approximately 2 years my parents' financial resources dropped rapidly. BV guided them through the process of dividing their assets so my father could afford to continue living in the Townhouse apartment while my mother received medical assistance, and lived in the skilled nursing area. Both parents died in 2002.

I have experienced the power of love and community in action here at Brethren Village in the past and in the present.

From the community's response to my family's barn burning, to BV's response to my parents' needs, and to the BV community welcoming my husband and me, I have seen the power of God's love expressed through community. When we all pull together by infusing everything that we do with compassion and caring for the well-being of each other and the greater community we can maintain the mission of Brethren Village.
