

Nathan Becker, Emmett Boyanowski, Jacob Gaydos, Nathan May, Dylan Plank, and Drew Tuckey spent their summer at BV helping to streamline medical records, conduct operational reviews, and document special items around campus. Nathan Becker, administrative services intern, conducted an operational review of food and dining in conjunction with Sodexo, BV's contracted food and dining provider. In addition, Nate also worked to document the many memorial trees and benches around campus given by families in memory of their loved ones.

Nathan May, Jacob Gaydos, Emmett Boyanowski, Dylan Plank, and Drew Tuckey, technology interns, spent their days de-stapling, scanning, and shredding medical records. Averaging 40,000-50,000 scans per day, the interns scanned a total of 1,053,941 pages, or 10,500 lbs., of paper. Stacked in a pile, those pages would be taller than Big Ben! The scanned records are now stored in Brethren Village's digital archive, which can be easily organized and searched by medical professionals that need valuable information.

BV is grateful for the work of these wonderful interns, and thank them for joining the team this summer!
