

Allen Hauser is Presented with a Lifetime Achievement Award



BV Resident Allen Hauser was honored with an International Bureau of Epilepsy (IBE) & the International League Against Epilepsy (ILAE) congress award for his significant international contributions to advance the cause of epilepsy. Allen was presented with the Lifetime Achievement Award, the highest award bestowed by IBE/ILAE, in recognition of his life-long study, teaching, treating and research of the disease.

Allen is Professor Emeritus of Neurology and Epidemiology at Columbia University where he has taught, done research and treated people with epilepsy over the past 40 years. According to International Epilepsy News, Issue 4, "[Allen's] accomplishments over five decades include studies on ageand gender-related incidence and prevalence, prognosis for seizure remission, concept

on recurrence after acute and unprovoked seizures, studies of mortality, quantification of risk for epilepsy for conditions such as stroke, brain trauma, CNS infection and others, unravelling bi-directional association between epilepsy and co-morbidities, epidemiologic studies of status epilepticus. These studies revolutionized the understanding of epidemiology and risk factors of epilepsy and found the ground of the ILAE operational classification of the disease."

"I'm humbled to receive this incredible honor," Allen said upon returning from the awards ceremony in Bangkok. He has been a Resident at Brethren Village for 12 years and lives in a cottage. Allen loves to meet up with his friends and team members and stay healthy at the BV pool!

and Talk-to-Text!






Senior Games were held in May at Spooky Nook
