Smart*Talk* for Seniors

The world around us is getting "smarter," but that doesn't mean technology is always easy to understand. These handy tips will help you decode some of the tech-talk you might be hearing.

Tip 3 Apple vs Android – what device do I have?

The main difference between the two types of smart phones is how the devices function and what type of platform they use for all the technical stuff. But don't worry – both types of products are great!

- Apple devices include any product sold by Apple: Phones, iPads, Mac
- Androids are devices sold by any other manufacturer: Samsung phones, Sony phones, Google phones, etc.

Tip 4 Text abbreviations: NVM, IDK, LMK

If you feel tech savvy enough to text or email, you can use these easy abbreviations to communicate with fewer words or characters.

- IDK means "I don't know." Example: "IDK Emily's phone number."
- NVM means "nevermind." Example: "Okay, nvm."
- LMK means "let me know." Example: "Want to take a walk at 3PM? LMK!"

Tip 5 How to make a stronger, safer password

Protecting your information online is more important - and necessary now more than ever. To avoid the possibility of a hack or being vulnerable to an online scammer, a strong password will help to keep your information safe.

- Make your password case sensitive. Alternate upper and lower cases. *Example: hEILoThErE*
- Use numbers and characters that aren't typical. Example: ^, ~, %.
- Don't use anything personal. No dog names or middle names!
- Most importantly, do not use the same password for everything. Keep a password journal in a safe place to help you remember.

Tip 6 What are apps?

The term "app" is short for applications, and are typically used and installed on smartphones as a quick way to access important information that you need frequently. Here are some great examples of helpful smartphone apps.

- Medication apps. Example: Medisafe and CareZone to help manage medication, including pick-up schedules, dosages, and refill alerts.
- News and Weather apps. Example: Accuweather and NPR
- Brain-game apps: "Words with Friends" is the smartphone version of Scrabble™. Play with friends and family near and far from your phone!

We talked to Mary on why she chose Brethren Village and moved in amidst a pandemic – and why she'd do it again.




"What ultimately brought you to Brethren Village?"

After living in Florida on my own for a few years, my son and I thought it was time to make the move to be closer to him here in Lititz. So I rented an apartment in Kissel Hill in 2019 to get to know the area and we started looking. I actually had my mind set on moving into a different community before visiting Brethren Village. But that changed when I came here. They showed me this cottage and I was sold!

"Your move-in period was right when COVID-19 hit the area. What were your fears, if any, about moving in during a pandemic?"

Of course I had some concerns. But, I was already committed to this. In my mind it was a done deal and I said to myself, "well, let's make the best of it!"



"What was your move-in process like?"

I actually had to make the drive up from Florida alone with just my cat. I sold my condo almost completely furnished, and for the few things I kept, Brethren Village helped me arrange for a small pod to be delivered to Lancaster.

On April 3rd, Susie, the BV marketing associate I'd been working with, was there right at the front gate waiting for me. I had to quarantine as soon as I got in, so Susie made sure I had groceries, and essentials delivered right to me.

Through no fault of BV, however, that storage pod with my furniture didn't get here until a week after I had arrived! I had everything I needed thanks to Susie. Because the community was closed, my son couldn't help

out. So, when my pod did arrive, Susie also helped me arrange a moving company to help unload it.

"How has your experience been since moving in?"

I was able to meet some neighbors as we would pass each other while out on walks. People would stop while I was gardening outside to chat about what I was working on. I've been enjoying all of the activities offered; wreath making, stained glass ornaments, painting. And after

a while you start to see the same people and make some friendships.



I had already belonged to a golf league here, so once that opened back up in June, 2020, I was able to enjoy that. When things were closed down, I was able to keep up with my bridge partner in Florida thanks to online gaming clubs.

The staff have been so nice and helpful. They're always around for

maintenance or anything, really. I had some problems with my TV and a young lady from the tech team came and fixed it. I also had to get something notarized and BV handled that for me, too.



The concierge has really been very helpful! Honestly, I would do this all again if I had to.

"What would you say to people considering a move to BV during this time?"

Well, I would say to just do it. It may take a little more time but it's just as safe and easy to move in. They have to be optimistic, so it may depend on their personality, but everything will fall into place if you have the right attitude.
