Fidget Blankets provide sensory stimulation for Residents

You don't need to be on campus long to see that Brethren Village is a community of helpers. No matter where you look there are Residents and Team Members who are willing to pitch in and help those in need.

Earlier this year, Team Member Laura Miller reached out to Volunteer Services with a special request aimed to help Residents in The Courtyards. She pitched the idea of fidget blankets, which could benefit Residents in memory support.

Who stepped up to fulfill this request? Volunteers from BV's sewing group, including Lois Snader, Gloria Grubb, Erma Miller, Lynne Buckwalter and Marie Bachman.

"Many Residents in The Courtyards have dementia," said Laura, a Therapeutic Recreation Manager. "One thing that can happen with dementia as it progresses is that Residents have more sensory needs."



Commonly called fidget blankets or activity mats, these therapeutic tools can help calm anxiety and provide stimulation for people experiencing cognitive challenges. The lap-sized blankets and mats are made from different fabrics and can incorporate zippers, buttons, snaps and even Velcro. These interactive elements combine to stimulate the senses through different textures and activities.

"Making a fidget pad was very interesting and very much needed," added Erma.

"I received a phone call from Lois Snader with the sewing group that they had three fidget blankets completed, and they are working on more," said Laura.

Not only did the sewing group do all the handiwork on the blankets, but they also did some research before they got started. One thing they learned was to use fabric that had a soft backing, so the blankets would stay comfortably on people's laps. Another important thing was to ensure items were securely fastened. The group learned that textures and sounds were key elements to include. They incorporated squeakers, stitched in pockets, attached buckles and included marble mazes for individuals to work through.

"Making the mats was a creative craft," said Lynne. "It was fun, and I loved the process."

"[The sewing group] actually inspired me to try to make my own at home," added Laura.

"This is a great example of how we have come together as a community to show Residents that we care."

The project, which started with a simple request, proved to be a fun and creative volunteer opportunity. In the end, the group made over a dozen fidget blankets.

"Our Volunteers keep BV strong and vibrant with their servant hearts," said Joanna Rudisill, Director of Volunteer and Retail Services.

"We are blessed to have over 300 volunteers that desire to give back to help make every day better for our Residents and Team Members. The reason I made the fidgets was to help, and I really enjoyed doing them. I put my love on each of them," added Gloria.

How long have you lived at Brethren Village? 6 years


